Eligibility Requirements

- Builder must complete an online Energy Star Orientation Training and be registered as an Energy Star Partner
- HVAC Contractor must be Energy Star Certified
- Builder agrees to update program application with any changes to the project or construction schedule
- Builder agrees to coordinate inspections with assigned ENERGY STAR Contractor
- Homes must meet ENERGY STAR program standards to qualify for label and financial incentives
- Homes must be separately metered, new residential construction or a complete building rehabilitation
- Homes can be single-family, multi-family or townhouse style construction three stories or less in height
- Windows must be ENERGY STAR rated or better
- At least (one) ENERGY STAR bath fan operated by programmable timer is required
- Electrical service must be provided by an electric utility sponsor
- Construction on the home must be “completed” by December 31, 2009 to receive financial incentives unless the sponsoring utility has approved a rebate extension
